2015 ENDSLEIGH SENIOR COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP

The July fixtures in the **ENDSLEIGH** Senior County Championship will confirm this season's semi-finalists with only Shropshire in Section Four likely to have guaranteed their place in the last four.

They have a 106 chalk advantage over second placed Staffordshire, who they meet in their final match, and it is going to take a mighty result from their opponents to overhaul them at the top of the league even though a Staffordshire victory will see them both finish level on points. Staffordshire will need a repeat of their result against the Isle of Man in which they inflicted a 106 chalk defeat on the Manxmen. Shropshire meanwhile got past Lancashire by 65.

The winners of Section Four will play the winners of Section Three. Here it is a straight fight between the defending champions Warwick & Worcester and Yorkshire to see who makes it to the semi-final. Both sides are level on points after two matches played, the latest seeing the champions losing by 40 at Potteries & District but their home side saved the day with a 66 chalk victory. Yorkshire finished 2 chalks off a triple figure victory over Merseyside winning home and away. Whoever wins between the top two will qualify for the semi-finals although Warwick & Worcester can afford to draw as they have a 1 chalk aggregate advantage. In the other match, again the Potteries & District can afford to draw their match with Merseyside as they have a far superior aggregate advantage with both sides on nil points.

Sections One and Two are pretty much identical to each other in points scored and aggregate differences. Derbyshire hold the advantage in Section One after their 68 chalk victory over Cumbria maintained their 100% start. They now play Cheshire in their final match of the section, Cheshire losing to Greater Manchester by 32 in the June fixtures. Cumbria need a big result against Greater Manchester to avoid finishing bottom of the section.

Wales won a hard fought encounter with North Lancs & Fylde in Section Two claiming victory by just 14. They now face bottom side South Yorkshire who lost by 35 to North Midlands. However, should Wales lose and North Lancs & Fylde or North Midlands win, either side could overtake the Welshmen at the top of the table.

Following the completion of each match the individual scores will be posted, usually within 24 hours, when they can be downloaded and/or printed. 2015 DRAKES PRIDE JUNIOR COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP

YORKSHIRE won the big match in the **DRAKES PRIDE** Junior County Championship when they inflicted a 30 chalk defeat on defending champions, Warwick & Worcester.

Yorkshire's Danny Teale got the home side off to a tremendous start with 21-3 opening card at Broad Oak BC, one of ten Yorkshire winners in a 54 chalk victory. Warwick & Worcester took the spoils over at the George BC where Adam Patrick led from the front with a 21-8 opener while Jack Whitehead closed the match with the same card. Yorkshire though battled hard to come away from the George with a creditable 24 chalk defeat. With just the July fixtures remaining, South Yorkshire stand in the way of their neighbours clinching the **Section Three** title and a place in the semi-finals. They overcame a young North Lancs & Fylde team with some ease to set them up nicely for their forthcoming derby.

The three-team **Section One** will be decided when Shropshire, last season's runners-up, take on Staffordshire next month. Staffordshire made their season's debut with a narrow 14 chalk victory over Greater Manchester who now qualify for the Supplementary County Championship in August. The two met in the semi-final stage last year with Shropshire coming out on top by 64 on that occasion.

Wales have almost certainly booked their place in the semi-finals with another big win in **Section Two**, this time over Lancashire by 104. They struggled at home to win by just 18 but their strong away side came back from the Red Rose county with all twelve winners. Merseyside opened their account with a 39 chalk victory over Potteries & District. They won by 60 at home claiming ten winning jacks but lost by 21 away where they took four of the first five games, four of them to single figures!

With still no matches played in **Section Four**, Derbyshire and North Midlands will play their only match of the roundrobin stage with the winners going straight through to the semi-finals.
