2021 BCGBA SENIOR COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP KNOCKOUT TROPHY



With the Senior County Championship unable to run in its usual format due to Covid restrictions, after consultation with all county associations, for 2021, it was decided that a knockout format would be used, played on the first Sunday of each month from July through to October. The normal format will return in 2022.

The draw (below) will be played straight through with the winners of Yorkshire v Merseyside playing Wales in the next round, Potteries & District or North Midlands taking on South Yorkshire or Cumbria, Greater Manchester or Staffordshire facing North Lancs & Fylde or Shropshire and Warwick & Worcester or Lancashire meeting the winners of the Derbyshire v Cheshire clash.

The winning county in each match will be the county that has the best overall aggregate from both venues. However, in the event of a draw the following order of criteria will determine the winners.

- The county with the most individual winners progresses to the next round.
- If it still remains a draw, the county with the best winner will progress to the next round.
- If it still remains a draw, the county with the second, third, fourth etc best winner will progress to the next round.

Teams this year do not have to be exchanged until 14 days prior to each match and it is hoped that all counties will live-score their games as their match progress. BCG LADIES COMPETITION COMMITTEE

COUNTY CUP 2021 - SUNDAY 18th JULY - 9.30am

The British Crown Green Ladies have also changed the format of their County Championship this year, again after consultation with all counties.

The format will be on the same lines as the Veterans County Championship where teams have been divided into groups and will play each other on a round robin basis. The winners of each group will qualify for finals day at a central venue on Sunday 19th September.

Not all counties chose to enter a team with some entering two teams. To reduce the amount of travelling it was agreed to assign the teams in either the northern sections or southern sections. Groups 'A', 'B' and 'C' being from the north with groups 'D' and 'E' from the south.

The winning county in each match will receive two points with one point for a draw. Once all group matches have been completed the team with the most points will qualify for finals day. However, in the event of a tie on points the winner that progresses to the final day will be determined by the following order.

- best aggregate score (total shots for minus total shots against)
- the team with the most overall winners
- the team with the best winner when the team, or teams, played each other (i.e. if Team 'A' and Team 'C' are tied on points the best winner from this match will count)
- the team with the second, third etc best winner when the team, or teams, played each other (i.e. if Team 'A' and Team 'C' are tied on points the next best winner from this match will count)

COMPETITIONS



Not all of our competitions will run during the 2021 season with the BCGBA World Club Championship, Veterans County Championship, Junior County Championship, Senior Supplementary County Championship and Champion of Champions cancelled until next year.

Apart from the County Cup and Singles Merit, all ladies competitions have been cancelled as there was little appetite from the ladies counties to participate this year.

The format for entry has changed slightly this year for both the men's and ladies competitions and players should contact their local county regarding entry into any competition

In the men's competitions, each of the sixteen counties will receive two qualifiers for the Senior Merit Trophy, Junior Merit Trophy and Veterans Handicap Trophy (Jack & Jean Isherwood Veterans Championship). This year, the British Parks CGBA will also receive two entries in the Veterans Handicap Trophy. The Centenary Mixed Pairs will run in its normal format where the number of qualifiers on finals day each county receives is based on the number of entries received at county level.

In the Ladies Singles Merit, each county receives three entries with some receiving four entries via a random draw to make up the 64 strong field. The Isle of Man has requested to only have two entries.

The draws for each competition will be posted on the BCGBA website (bcgba.org.uk/2021 Competitions).

It should be noted that the BCGBA will follow any Government protocols that may be in place at the time of each of our individual competition finals which may result in spectators being asked to give their details for track and trace purposes. This year, spectators will be able to bring in their own chairs to each venue.
