## **PUDSEY WIN WORLD CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP**

In an all-Yorkshire final, **Pudsey** came out on top against arch-rivals, Lower Hopton, in the 2022 BCGBA World Club Championship, winning by just six chalks in a tremendous match.



With qualifying sessions having taken place over the four previous Sundays at the excellent Spen Victoria Cricket, Bowling & Athletic Club, the final eight teams returned to play to a winner.

Pudsey accounted for Lightwood (Potteries & District) by 38 in their quarter-final match and booked their place in the final at the expense of Llay Welfare (Wales) by 48.

Lower Hopton meanwhile were rampant in their quarter-final fixture against an under-par George Warley (Warwick & Worcester) side, claiming all eight winning cards and restricting their opponents to just 67. In their semi-final, they overcame the challenge of neighbours, Dearne Sports (South Yorkshire), winning by 34.

There was little between the sides throughout the final with Lower Hopton holding a six chalk advantage at the halfway stage.

With one game left on the green, the teams were tied at 121 chalks apiece, but David Poole held his nerve to secure the vital chalks for a Pudsey victory.

BCGBA President, Ken Howarth, made the presentation to the Pudsey captain, Jon Edmondson.

## LADIES ALL SET FOR THEIR CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

The BCG Ladies get their season underway on Sunday 24th April with the 2022 Club Championship. Disappointingly, only eleven of the twenty-one counties have representatives competing at Bridgewater Bowling Club, North Shropshire, where play gets underway at 9.30am.

Defending champions and four-time winners, Wrockwardine Wood from Shropshire (pictured below), will be hoping to make it a hattrick of titles but former winners St Oswalds (Cheshire), Wharton Cons (Mid Cheshire) and New Mill (Yorkshire) will be hoping to end their winning streak.

## NORMAL SERVICE TO RESUME FOR COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The **Men's Senior County Championship** returns to its usual format this season with Warwick & Worcester aiming for a third title in successive years by navigating their way through the group stages, the semi-final and culminating in victory in the final.

Derbyshire, who they defeated in the 2019 semi-final and 2013 final, are their first opponents in Section 1 with matches against Staffordshire and Cheshire to follow. Yorkshire, who beat Warwick & Worcester in last season's competition played on a knockout basis, open against North Lancs & Fylde then play Potteries & District and Greater Manchester in their Section 2 fixtures. Beaten finalist in 2019, Merseyside, start their Section 3 campaign against Cumbria with further tough matches to follow against South Yorkshire and Shropshire, who they beat in the 2019 semi-final. Finally, in the three-team Section 4, North Midland sit out the opening round of fixtures and will play the losing team from the Lancashire v Wales clash in June.

Junior bowls has been decimated following Covid with only four counties able to field full sides to compete in the **Junior County Championship**. Defending champions, Yorkshire play Wales in the first round of fixtures with Staffordshire taking on Yorkshire. A separate competition for those counties that have insufficient juniors to compete in the Junior County Championship has been organised. See page 7 for details.

Like their men, Warwick & Worcester ladies are going for a hat-trick of titles in the **Ladies Senior County Championship** following their victories in the 2018 and 2019 campaigns. Mid Cheshire are their first opponents and if they come through Section 4 on top they could face Shropshire in the semi-final, in a repeat of the 2019 final. Shropshire must first overcome the challenge of the three 'Norths', Lancs & Fylde, Derbyshire and Warwickshire. The two defeated 2019 semi-finalists, South Yorkshire and Yorkshire meet in the opening round of Section 2 while two former champions, Lancashire and Greater Manchester, face each other in the first round of fixtures in Section 1. Unfortunately, Cumbria have withdrawn from ladies events in 2022 meaning South Staffordshire receive a bye in the Presidents. They will play the losing team from the North Shropshire v Staffordshire fixture in June.

Callum qualified by defeating Greg Smith (Warwick & Worcester) 21-17 in the final of the Coors Meole Brace Open. Elliott McGuinness has his name down on the reserve list following his victory in the West Brom Open.

Unfortunately, the St Georges Open will not be going ahead this year so the Sandal Classic will move up from the Reserve List into the list of Qualifying Competitions.
