CALLUM WRAIGHT joined a select group of bowlers who have achieved multiple successes in the BCGBA Senior Individual Merit when he added his second

1, inflicted a heavy 21-8 defeat over Gary Owen (Potteries & District), who also lost in the 2019 final at Rolls Royce, Derbyshire.

BCGBA President, Ken Howarth, finally got to present the trophy to a worthy champion.

Callum was one of four previous winners in the 64-strong field.

Noel Burrows (Cheshire), the winner in 1976 and 2010, had eight on the card before the Cumbrian champion, Ian France, could get going. France gradually clawed back the deficit until he got to within one of the two-time champion at 11-12. Burrows pulled away again to leave him just two chalks from victory at 19-16 but France held his nerve to win 21-19.

Ashley Daykin (Yorkshire) led 17-9 against the Merseyside champion, Josh Bunting. Bunting got back into the game at 15-18 but couldn't continue his momentum as the 2014 champion won 21-15. In round 2, he trailed Glen Herbert (Warwick & Worcester) 6-2 but fought back to win 21-12 though his hopes of progressing to the last eight were thwarted by Aaron Williams (South Yorkshire) who came from 6-10 down to win a 21-20 thriller.

Tom Vickers (Cheshire), the winner in 2015, got off to a great start to defeat Adam Hartley (Derbyshire) 21-5 in round one and then progressed to the last 16 with a 21-15 triumph over Josh Thomas (Yorkshire). His journey would end in the next round.

The day though belonged to the 2009 champion, Callum Wraight, who started his march to the title with an opening 21-11 success over Ben Percival (North Midlands) then came through a titanic battle against Lancashire's Billy Speed, 21-17, which saw the players level on no fewer than ten occasions, the latter being 17 across.

However, with the players level at 19 across, he was staring at a last 16 defeat to Tom Vickers with the former champion holding the two chalks he required for the game. An amazing full corner strike by Wraight cleared the jack off the green and he then capitalised on two poor woods from Vickers to record a dramatic victory.


From here on, Wraight was peerless as he restricted his final three opponents to just 25 chalks between them. Russell Prosser (Warwick & Worcester) scored 8 in the quarter-finals, Ian France, who led 7-6, fared no better in a 21-8 semi-final defeat and in the final, Gary Owen found himself 10-nil down after five ends, eventually succumbing to a 21-9 loss.

SHROPSHIRE AND YORKSHIRE CONTEST COUNTY FINALS



Shropshire and Yorkshire will contest both the 2022 BCGBA Endsleigh Senior County Championship and BCG Ladies County Championship finals which will conclude in September.



In the Men's semi-finals, both finalists recorded comfortable victories winning home and away. Shropshire won by 31 in their home leg at Sinclair Bowling Club, with Scott Harries' 21-4 and

Richard Lawson's 21-9 getting them off to the perfect start. Over at Lancashire's Garswood Hall green, Andrew Judson (21-6) and Gary Neal (21-9) starred in a 33-chalk victory.

In the other semi-final, Yorkshire faced arch-rivals Warwick & Worcester and also won home and away. Mark Hughes (21-8) and Kieran Smith (21-9) were the star performers on their Whitkirk Bowling Club green which resulted in a 45-chalk success whilst Jack Dyson's 21-9 card at Ye Olde Knowle helped secure a 17-chalk victory after the jacks had been shared six apiece.

Champions! Ryan P Williams, Belinda Lloyd & Linda Williams flew the flag for Wales as they were victorious in the 2022 BCGBA Junior Individual Merit and BCG Ladies Dorothy Piearce Memorial Pairs.


RYAN P WILLIAMS made it a quintet of Welsh juniors to lift the tremendous BCGBA Junior Individual Merit Trophy, emulating the achievements of G Jones (1976), M Halliwell (1981), A Armstrong (2016) and M Worden (2018). Ryan came through the 32-strong field unscathed in his five games on the day at Ashton Cricket Club in Greater Manchester.

Ryan was dominant in all of his games, opening with two 21-10 victories, dispatching Cumbria's Jack Brannon (Cumbria) in the first round and Staffordshire's Owen Evans in round two.

His quarter-final encounter with Louis Furniss (Derbyshire) saw him trail 9-8 after the early exchanges but a nine-break brought daylight between the two players at 17-9. Furniss fought back to 15-18 but was unable to keep hold of the jack as Ryan booked his place in the semi-final with a 21-15 victory.

In the semi-finals, Ryan was in control from the off, winning 21-10 against South Yorkshire's Jacob Parratt to face Thomas Scorah (Yorkshire) in the final.

Scorah had made his way to the final at the expense of Samuel Jarrett (Lancashire) 21-12, Zac Diamond (Cheshire) 21-15, Owen Sherriff (Derbyshire) 21-13 and Jordyn Hughes (Staffordshire) 21-17.



In the final, Ryan saw his 16-7 advantage reduced to a solitary chalk as Scorah went on an eight-break to trail 15-16. But as in his game with Furniss, Ryan reclaimed the jack and ran out a 21-15 winner.



BELINDA LLOYD & LINDA WILLIAMS defeated Fay Carson & Janet Hargreaves (Staffordshire), 21-13, in the final of the BCG Ladies Dorothy Piearce Memorial Pairs.

The Welsh pairing found the Fox Lane Sports & Social Club greens to their liking as they accounted for Judy Peech & Lesley Welling (Derbyshire) 21-17 in their first round game then won a titanic battle with Christine Davies & Alyson Evans (North Warwickshire) 21-20. NORTH DERBYSHIRE PARKS CLAIM VETS TITLE



NORTH DERBYSHIRE PARKS overcame the challenge of Merseyside, Shropshire and the defending champions, Potteries & District to win the 2022 BCGBA Veterans County Championship, played at Owley Wood Recreation Club (Cheshire).

They started the day with a 21-chalk victory over Merseyside, then beat Shropshire by 8 and kept their 100% record intact with a 6-chalk defeat of the holders, Potteries & District, to claim the title.

SOUTH YORKSHIRE WIN A SECOND SUPPLEMENTARY CHAMPIONSHIP



SOUTH YORKSHIRE overcame a strong Derbyshire side to win the **BCGBA Senior Supplementary County Championship** for a second time. They came out on top in a close encounter, winning by just 5 chalks with the eight jacks shared.

Played at Fox Lane Sports & Social Club (North Lancs & Fylde) they topped their group undefeated following victories over Isle of Man by 10, Cheshire, who they defeated in the 2008 final, by 21 and Greater Manchester by 9.

Derbyshire had earlier drawn with Potteries & District but defeated Cumbria (1) and North Midlands (12).

OWEN WINS THE INAUGURAL 18-25 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP



OWEN TURNER made the short trip across the River Mersey to Windle Bowling Club (Merseyside) to claim the inaugural **BCGBA 18-25 Open Championship**.

He was rarely troubled in his opening two games, leaving Daniel Edmondson (Lancashire) on 8 and Fraser Rigg (Cumbria) on 10. He would then face three opponents from Greater Manchester, starting with Mitch Toth in the quarter-finals.

It was nip and tuc all the way but with Toth saving the game to draw level at 19 across he misjudged the speed of the green, sending both his bowls into the pit at the next end to leave Turner a simple two for game.

Like Callum Wraight in the Senior Merit, Turner was peerless as he despatched Tom Eccles 21-8 in the semi-finals and Ben Gloag 21-10 in the final.
