FENTON PRIVATE DENY THE HOLDERS IN WORLD FINAL

FENTON PRIVATE (Potteries & District) scored a tremendous victory in the opening BCGBA competition of the season denying the defending champions, Pudsey (British Parks), a second successive title in the World Club Championship.

The 'Potters' won by 18 chalks when all scores were added up at Spen Victoria Cricket, Bowling & Athletic Club in Yorkshire with Gary Owen's 21-9 card proving crucial in an otherwise close match.

The jacks were equally shared in the first four blocks of the final with Owen's single-figure victory ensuring his side took a slender two-chalk lead going into the final four games. James Hanson put the holders back in front following a 21-18 success but Fenton hit back by claiming the remaining three cards to secure their first victory in the competition.

Fenton, having defeated Garswood Hall (Lancashire) and the 2017 winners, King George V (Warwick & Worcester), to qualify for finals day, made their way to the final by first overcoming the challenge of The George Warley (Warwick & Worcester) by 12 chalks in a close game throughout. Their semi-final opponents, Crossland Moor from the host county, proved another tough test but it was thanks to Steve Morrey's 21-4 card that his side made it through to the final with 14 chalks to spare.

Pudsey's day started with a 27-chalk victory over two-time champions, Parkfield Labour (North Lancs & Fylde). They got off to a great start thanks to Gary Wyke's 21-5 card, supported by Tom Hanson who won 21-9. They then got the better of Derbyshire's Stretton Anglesey at the penultimate stage with James Hanson (21-5) and Jon Edmondson (21-9) being instrumental in their 38-chalk success.

BCGBA Deputy President, Frank James, made the presentation of the trophy to the Fenton Private team.

YORKSHIRE OUT TO DOMINATE THE COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIPS AGAIN

The County Championship season is upon us with BCGBA men, juniors and ladies playing their respective championships over the first three Sundays of each month between May and September. Yorkshire dominated the championships in 2022 with a clean sweep of titles and must start season 2023 as strong favourites.

The men take centre stage on the first Sunday (7th May) of each month in the **BCGBA Senior County Championship** with this season's fixtures bringing together two of the game's heavyweights in the opening round of matches. Yorkshire, start their title defence against arch-rivals, Warwick & Worcester, in Section 2 with the winners taking the advantage into their remaining two matches, though South Yorkshire and last season's defeated semi-finalists, Lancashire, will have a big say on who qualifies for the semi-finals from this tough section.

Elsewhere, Shropshire, beaten by the white rose county in September's final, open against North Midlands in Section 3 with matches against Cheshire and Greater Manchester to follow, while in Section 1 it is hard to pick a winner from Derbyshire, North Lancs & Fylde, Merseyside and Wales. In the three-team Section 4, Potteries & District and Staffordshire get the season underway with Cumbria eagerly awaiting their result as they play the losers in the June fixtures.

Once again there will be the same four counties in the **BCGBA Junior County Championship** with matches played on the second Sunday (14th May) of each month. Yorkshire play Wales in their first match, followed by Staffordshire and will be hoping to celebrate yet another title against last season's runners-up, Shropshire, in July.

The third Sunday (21st May) of each month is reserved for the ladies playing in the **BCGBA Ladies County Championship**. Champions, Yorkshire, have been drawn in Section 4 and play North Midlands in their May fixture followed by North Warwickshire in June and Greater Manchester in July. The section winners will play the winners of Section 3 in the semi-finals which contains last year's beaten finalists, Shropshire. They play South Staffordshire, Lancashire and the Mavis Dearden Supplementary County Championship winners from 2022, South Yorkshire.



Last season's beaten semifinalists, Wales and Warwick & Worcester meet in the opening fixtures in Section 1 with Cheshire playing Staffordshire in the other section match, while in Section 2, Burton & District, Dudley & District, North Lancs & Fylde and North Shropshire will battle it out for a place in the semifinals.

With Cumbria back in the fold, the **BCGBA Ladies Presidents County Championship** has a full complement of teams. Their return has paired them

against Merseyside in the May fixtures with Mid Cheshire and North Derbyshire meeting in the other match of the section.

FIFTH TITLE FOR WROCKWARDINE WOOD

For the first time since before the pandemic, a full complement of sixteen teams took part in the **BCGBA Ladies Club Championship**. The county winners from 2022 saw groups 1 and 2 played at Grange Sports & Social Club while Groups 3 and 4 played at Tetley Walker BC. The semi-finals and final were played at Monk Sports & Social Club.

WROCKWARDINE WOOD (Shropshire) scored an impressive fifth title in the beating former winners, St Oswalds (Cheshire), by 17 chalks in the final.

The two sides could not be separated after the opening four jacks of the final with Shropshire's Louise Cotton's 15-6 card cancelled out by Karen Galvin's 15-5 card leaving both sides on 46 chalks. Jean Wanbon gave St Oswalds the advantage as the second half of the final got underway handing in a timely 15-6 card. However, it was all in vain as Sarah Weaver romped to a 15-0 success, supported by Holly Bishton (15-3) to ensure Wrockwardine Wood celebrated another success in this competition.

In the first semi, Wrockwardine Wood had to overcome a 15-chalk advantage by Castle Private (Cheshire) at the halfway stage in their match with Wendy Allen (15-8), Elaine Burgess (15-9) and Katie Harrop (15-9) all in fine form. Wrockwardine hit back strongly in the match's second half, with Sarah Weaver (15-0) and Chelsea Gregory (15-3) seeing their side through to the final with an overall 15-chalk victory.

In the other semi-final. St Oswalds were rarely troubled in their 30-chalk success over Bamford. Beth Kemp (15-1), Margaret Williams (15-2), Louise Wilkins (15-5) and Karen Galvin (15-9) were the top scorers for the Cheshire side with Natalie Nelson (15-9) the best of Bamford's three winners.
