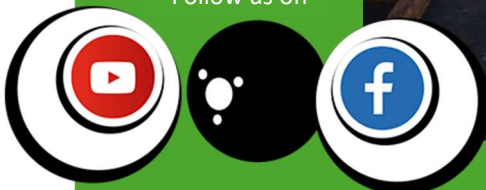

Centenary Mixed Pairs Championship Rules 2025



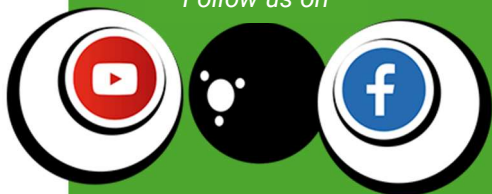

BCGBA Centenary Mixed Pairs Championship Rules

- 1.** This event shall be known as the Centenary Mixed Pairs Championship and will be open to partnerships of one female player and one male player.
- 2.** The number of competitors on finals day from each County shall be decided annually by the Competitions Committee based on the current year's entries.
- 3.** Each county will pay a fee, agreed by the Competitions Committee, in respect of their qualifying representatives.
- 4.** Players can only qualify for the final stages of this event from one of the sixteen BCGBA County Associations. Each County Association will be allowed a minimum of one qualifying pair, provided there are a minimum of 8 entries.
- 5.** All counties must hold a qualifying competition to determine their representatives at BCGBA finals. Qualifying must take place in the year of the competition and before the date requested for counties to submit their representatives.
- 6.** All games shall be 21up off 3.
- 7.** No player will be allowed to qualify for the final stages of the event on his or her own green and should he or she qualify for the final on a green of which he or she is a playing member, then the handicap for the final day shall be reduced by 2 shots for each player it applies to.
- 8.** The Competitions Committee will decide on the final venue which must have two suitable greens.
- 9.** Any county that fails to submit the required information by the due date will be excluded from representation. An appropriate fine will be imposed on any defaulting county.
- 10.** The appointment of Referees and Green Managers will be made in conjunction with the British Crown Green Referees Society (BCGRS).
